

# Castlecroft Primary School

## School Sport Funding Castlecroft Primary School - Sports Premium Funding

From September 2013 the government allocated funding directly to primary schools to support the provision of quality in PE and sport. Each school has received £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years.

At Castlecroft Primary, this will mean £11 379 per year. In addition there is £2779 from last year giving a total of £14158.

We have always seen health, PE and sport as being vital. As a result we have embedded the following practices/provisions over the past few years:

- Every Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 class receives 2 hours of PE per week.
- Our Year 5 and Year 6 classes receive weekly swimming lessons (Autumn and Summer Terms for Year 6 and Spring for Year 5) delivered by qualified swimming instructors (also Primary teaching staff) at Smestow Sports College.
- We offer a range of opportunities for extra-curricular activities and participate in sports competitions organised by WASPS (Wolverhampton Association for Sport in Primary Schools) and PASS (Partnerships and School Sport)
- Children are trained as Play Leaders, working at lunchtimes to improve their leadership skills and encourage their peers to be active.
- Sports Festivals for our Year 3 and 5 children.
- Our annual sports day.

The funding will allow us to build on these even further. From September 2014, the money will be used for the following:

Description	Cost (£)
To allow every KS2 class to be taught PE by our PE coordinator and class teacher Mr Morgan. In Years 5 and 6 he will deliver 2 PE lessons and in Years 3 and 4 he will deliver 1.	£9984
To provide out of school sporting club provision (including lunchtimes) for targeted groups of vulnerable children – we will offer netball, football, girls football, cross country, and a KS1 sports club in the Autumn Term. Mr Morgan is employed to deliver 3 after school clubs and coordinate competitions.	
To further develop and improve competitive sport within the school curriculum, providing more opportunities for extra-curricular sport & establish relationships with other schools and outside clubs – we plan to enter every available competitive sport offered by the WASPS and PASS teams.	
To allow Mr Morgan time to apply for funding grants to support the development of PE and sports clubs.	
To allow staff to attend professional development opportunities in PE/sport.	£400
To improve the quality & consistency of provision of PE & help improve staff confidence in their delivery in order to improve levels and standards.	
To fund coach transport for Year 3 and 5 Sports Festivals organised by the PASS team.	£360
The employment of a gymnastics coordinator to run an after school gymnastics club.	£240
To fund the employment of a lifeguard to supervise swimming lessons for Years 5 and 6.	£3198
Membership of the ASA School Swimming Charter – providing a structured programme and resources to help support school swimming lessons.	£60
To develop the provision for Gifted & Talented pupils & ensure that ALL pupils are provided with a high quality PE curriculum and those pathways exist for them to further progress their skills.	Included in the figures listed
Full membership of the Youth Sport Trust which will give us free and discounted places at conferences, networking events and professional development programmes, resources, support and expertise for the school a to the Youth Sport Trust Self Review Tool and access to discounts and offers.	£300
Membership of the British Gymnastics Association – providing resources and insurance for our delivery of gymnastics.	£17
New SAMBA football goals to ensure competitive matches are played to FA guidelines (half to be funded through FA grant)	£340
