Castlecroft Primary School Sports Premium Impact Statement Sept 2019 – July 2020

Our achievements in PE have been recognised by the award of the Sainsbury's School Games Gold Award, the fifth year running and subsequently the Platinum Award until 2021.

Key indicator 2: The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

- New website section and newsletters celebrating success.
- Established tracking system in place to track the participation of all children in school sport within school and outside of school and identify disadvantaged groups.
- Cancellation of sports Day due to Covid-19 meant we introduced and delivered our first Virtual Sports Day. Between 60 and 65 children competed with the event run via the schools Facebook page. Videos and pictures were then posted on Facebook by staff with each child earning points for their house by adding their post. This has been followed up with weekly sports challenges set online.

Key indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

- Successful applications for sports related funding grants and access to Capital Funding project to allow major revamp of school playing field.
- Attendance of National Pool Rescue Award allowing us as a school to deliver swimming lessons 'in house'.

- Increased confidence of our staff on leading and teaching areas of PE through regular CPD. NQT Staff have observed good practice from the PE co-ordinator and begun to take on responsibility of running their own after school sports clubs – cross country and athletics.
- Greater continuity between PE lessons and improved use of equipment, hall-time, and linkage between curriculum and competitive sport.

Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

- Planned revamp of Summer Term sports clubs to allow a greater range and include support from NQT teachers: rounders, tennis and cricket and Zumba dancing. This would have allowed more opportunities for less active children and a greater range of year groups – delayed due to Covid-19 Impact.

Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

Sports Clubs – **Effected by Covid-19 Lockdown** (missing Summer Term)

- 67% of children in KS2 regularly attended at least 1 lunchtime or after school sports club.
- 45% of children in Years 1 and 2 regularly attended at least 1 lunchtime or after school sports club.
- There have been 10 after school or lunchtime sports clubs offered covering 5 different sports with a club on offer to every year group from Reception to Year 6.

Inter-school competition

- There have been 13 opportunities for children to participate in competitive sport against other schools covering 6 different NGB sports.
- As a school, we entered 4 'b' sports teams and 1 'c' sports teams.
- 53% of our Year 6 children have represented the school in a Level 1 or 2 School Sports competition.
